

## INTEGRATED HOSPITAL CENTRE – IHC

### Key points

#### ▪ Overview

- The IHC project is intended to create an integrated hospital centre with a Large and integrated coverage of medical specialties, covered by specialized units, in order to provide to the Angolan citizens healthcare services to be delivered thru private, government and social services; supported own facilities, such as oxygen plant, drugs factory, ambulances, medical university and research centre in order to be fully autonomous.

#### ▪ Snapshot of health situation in Angola

- Healthcare is mainly provided by the government (Healthcare National System, called SNS);
- But services are clearly insufficient, and availability is less than required. Rate of access to health services is 44.6%;
- The PNDS (National Plan for Health Development) identified at a national level the need for 6 more central Hospitals, 12 State hospitals and 27 Municipality Hospitals and around d 4000 local health units.
- The need is clear and is intended to fight some worrying indicators such as:
  - Life expectancy of 52 years of age
  - Neonatal mortality rate of 42/1000
  - Mortality rate of children under 5 years of age of 195/1000
  - Maternal mortality rate of 4,5/1000
  - Mortality rate adults at 15-60 years of age of 314/1000

#### ▪ Project Key numbers

- The IHC is a private investment project own by Ambikamel and approved by the Angolan Government.
- It will be located in Luanda (Capital) next to the Express Way and road to Kilamba in a land plot adjoining the sports hall and national football stadium: total area of 623.780,00 m<sup>2</sup>; plots area of 368.441,80 m<sup>2</sup>; implantation area of 100.538,49 m<sup>2</sup>; building area of 373.354,96 m<sup>2</sup>; number of floors allowed = 7 and a total 6700 parking places.
- At its full capacity the IHC represents a total investment of 1.325 billion euros.
- 15/16 years return considering tax exemptions and other benefits agreed with Government.
- IHC will create around 3000 new jobs (70% specialized professionals);
- IHC medical university will prepare around 300 professionals (nurses/doctors) per cycle, wich will progressively reduce the number of expatriates;
- Local drug production will reduce the country needs for pharmaceutical products, then price and accessibility; same for oxygen. Both can fulfil some other African country's needs.

#### ▪ The purpose

- As stated before, this a private investment with government agreement and support;
- As private investors we aim to have a return on our investment. So we will target private “consumers”, but also will make agreements with government to open doors to the national health service and make available all our facilities, machines and human resources;
- But it's also clear for the promotors (Ambikamel) that our mission is more than provide private health to those who can pay or who can afford a health insurance. If this was the case all the dimensions would be smaller;
- We strongly believe and wish to open IHC facilities and technical, both human and machines, to the community and humanitarian services and organizations;
- Facilitating access to health to various levels of financial possibilities even if none, develop and implement in the community training in order to apply rules for good health, promote vaccination, ...free medical and other initiatives that will implement or promote with others.

We strongly believe that due to the size, despite the challenge, the IHC project will have a significant impact in healthcare in Angola, and not only with private “consumers”, but also, at some levels, an impact in surrounding African countries.
