

“From Market Access to Collaboration: Advancing India–Germany Health Partnerships”

India and Germany are celebrating 75 years of diplomatic relations in 2026. The India-German partnership is deepening across trade, technology and healthcare. Both countries have committed to stronger health cooperation, pandemic preparedness, tackling antimicrobial resistance, equitable access to affordable healthcare & medicines, and mobility of healthcare professionals. On the economic side, the India-EU Free Trade Agreement is expected to unlock substantial benefits for healthcare and medtech sectors. Lower tariffs, closer regulatory cooperation, and easier market access would strengthen supply chains and unlock joint investment in diagnostics, pharma, digital health, and devices. India's rapidly expanding healthcare ecosystem is also creating new avenues for German industry and institutions to engage. Germany is emerging as a preferred destination for Indian healthcare professionals. Against this backdrop, GHA has named India a key focus country this year, driven by strong member interest and demand. This event convenes Indian and German healthcare stakeholders together for focussed dialogue on opportunities for collaborations.
